In the community, Muñoz serves as an officer and executive board member of the Boy Scouts of America South Florida Chapter, and the 2019 recipient of its "Distinguished Citizen Award." He is also a board member of the Chapman Partnership for the Homeless.

Muñoz numerous other awards and recognitions include the 12th Annual "International Banking and Finance Award" by The Miami-Dade Beacon Council in 2014, and the inaugural "Philanthropist of the Year" award by Leukemia and Lymphoma Society of South Florida in 2015. He was named the "Florida Business Ambassador Award" by Gov. Rick Scott in 2015 and was appointed as a founding board member of the Florida Film and Television Investment Board in 1994 by Gov. Lawton Chiles.

As Miami's leading global trade organization, whose roots go back to 1971, the WTCM has generated more than \$3.8 billion in international sales over the past 30 years and stimulated the creation of thousands of new jobs.
